Highlights of the seminar:

Temporary works (TW) cover every phase of the construction of projects. TW include falsework, formwork, temporary steel platforms, excavation and lateral support (ELS), earth berms and site hoardings. TW pose the biggest single risk in the construction industry and are always safety and project critical. Failure can lead to serious consequences including death, injury, loss of reputation, project failure, heavy penalties and even imprisonment. Despite these risks, TW remain the most under-engineered and the least understood aspect of construction procurement. TW are most often designed by permanent works designers who design for the "inservice" life of the TW and not necessarily for the installation and removal of TW or how TW affect the construction sequence.

In this seminar, the speaker will address the challenges facing designers and contractors in both safety design and management strategies. Meanwhile, TW managements will be proposed for contractor implementations.

Mr. Iain Mowatt

Mr. Iain Mowatt has been both a temporary works designer and contractor with Gammon Construction and now works for CEEK, who specialises in design of permanent and temporary works for construction where constructability is the primary focus. Iain is a civil engineer and has been involved with the design and implementation of TW all his working life. He is the current chairman of the Hong Kong Temporary Works Forum, an industry lead initiative to fill the knowledge gaps in temporary works.
